# NOTES on THE FEVER 2016 by Burke Walker

You gather together in a room...and the person sitting across from you starts to tell an oddly unsettling story...Our narrator, intellectually curious and introspective by nature, is propelled, by an odd set of circumstances, to visit a foreign country where a revolution has taken place.

Delighted by her discoveries, she continues travelling...with far different results. She observes...She listens...She questions...and her safe, comfortable world is upended. Intellectually un-tethered and emotionally disoriented, a stranger to herself even, her quest for a seemingly elusive ideal--a moral foundation for economic justice--sends her into hallucinatory free-fall where she is dragged, screaming and protesting, to examine her own life as never before. In a fever-dream of argument and counter-argument, she gropes her way towards a new reality where self-serving lies no longer stick in her throat. And it's not over...

Wallace Shawn's 90-minute monologue is as stimulating, infuriating, and as demanding today as it was in 1990 when it opened, and when Llysa and I first embarked on the project nearly 20 years ago. And it is, just perhaps, even more relevant. This production is intended to be performed in private homes and is available for booking in 2016-2017.
